 - Liaise with external presenters and venues in relation to production needs of projects
 - Draft and issue technical plans to external venues and presenters
 - Draft and manage production schedules
 - Adequately resource technical and production staffing and equipment for projects
 - Coordinate local, national and international freight
 - Manage technical specifications for Slingsby's productions
 - Schedule, lead and minute production meetings
 - Source and secure additional equipment for projects as required
 - Ensure effective management of load in/load out of projects, delegating to touring production staff as required
